

Earth Day young visitors will be able to assemble a Watershed Discovery Nature Journal to explore and investigate the watershed related features outside in the native garden and also

indoors. The Santa Maria Utilities Department will offer water conservation tips and tools, museum garden demonstrations will feature how to use all those discarded egg shells as a plant growth enhancer and simple composting techniques. 


