Look closely at these photos taken in the museum's back garden. We feel so blessed to have more monarch butterfly caterpillars this year than ever before - 27 plus at any given time! If you want monarchs in your yard, plant native Narrow Leaf Milkweed, not the tropical milkweed that is sold in most nurseries. Tropical milkweed can harm monarchs by disrupting their migration and overwintering behavior and can exacerbate the spread of the OE parasite. We will have Narrow Leaf Milkweed seeds available soon for a small donation.

Board member and arborist, Scott Christian has studied the issue and assures the board and volunteers that the trees will survive and moths will depart. All the visitors and volunteers love the Monarch caterpillars which appeared in the Native Garden but did not feel fond of the literally millions of little black oak moth caterpillars that dropped on clothing and into hair and stuck to the building. Of course, the Museum did not use pesticide in spite of the problem. We are told that there is a "green" bacteria that may be used if the problem returns and is caught early. Mother Nature!

Luckily the oak caterpillars had mostly gone into pupa form by the time the 2025 NHM Summer Science Camp convened. Advisory board member, Laura Henderson had prepared the enthusiastic group of volunteers with her seasoned teaching guidance along with some great ideas from retired teacher, Penny Joaquin. Randy Cohen, one of the 2025 Earth Day Conservation award winners joined the team with his crickets and cockroaches, and we were off and running. Students had enjoyed learning so much in the thriving native garden, using their nature journals and magnifying glasses on the numerous insects in the garden and asking a million questions. 


